Oriental Fruit Fly update

The MPI response to the Oriental Fruit Fly has been a significant challenge to growers and packhouses within the Zone A region (PapatoetoeClover Park, Mangere, Auckland Airport, Otahuhu, Flatbush, Manurewa). The fly discovered was male and there seems to be no further detections in surveillance traps and importantly, no adverse reactions from NZ's trading partners- they are satisfied with the MPI response. Restrictions remain in place at the time of publishing this newsletter - see more details <u>here</u>.

Early response and really good compliance from impacted growers has been essential to this effort, and SGNZ acknowledge all fruit and vegetable growers who have contributed. And kudos to MPI - their proactive response has protected our future exports.

New Restricted Entry Intervals (REIs) for Pesticides - this impacts growers

Worksafe has finalised New Restricted Entry Intervals (REIs) for 101 substances, and it has been signed off as of 13 Dec 2024. This will come into **effect on 10 June 2025**, so the industry will have six months to implement it.

Can you supply 100 MT (or part thereof) of Camarosa Berries?

SGNZ is asked by Customs annually for a concessions for very specific IQF berries- so that FSL can avoid a tariff for importing frozen berries from other countries - some that do not have the same standards as NZ growers.

Last year, it was organic berries FSL specified. This year it's small (22-24mm) Camarosa. If Industry can supply, the amount of the concession application will be reduced by that amount available locally before it is advertised for objections to concessions.

2024 – 2025 Strawberry Mystery Shopping

Round 3 Summary (10-12 December 2024)



Microbial test results

- 6 samples tested
- 1 sample was a Round 2 follow-up
- Tested for E.coli, Faecal coliforms, Listeria, Salmonella, Staphylococcus.
- 1 sample followed-up from Round 3



Residue test results

- 6 residue samples tested
- 1 sample was a follow-up from Round 2
- 1 sample was followed up from Round 3



Strawberries were generally sold

- 63% Centre Display (5)
- 25% Side Chiller (2)
- 12% Other (1)



7 Stores visited, 8 samples collected:

- 5 Supermarket samples
- 2 Specialist retailer samples
- 1 Independent retailer sample

Comments:

- Sampling was undertaken in Christcurch on 10th December and Central Auckland on 12th December. The Christchurch sample was from Nelson; no other South Island product was found.
- Microbial test follow-up from November Round 2 was negative. December Round 3 had low levels of E. coli detected. This is a hygiene indicator.
- Residue test follow-up from November Round 2 continued to test positive. Residue test for Decmber Round 3 was followed-up.
- We purchased larger punnets in some cases but reported the price as 250 gm equivalent.
- Unlabelled punnets were observed but not purchased.

Where possible we will endeavour not to resample the same growers and unlabelled product will be commented on but not purchased due to traceability constraints.

2024 – 2025 Strawberry Mystery Shopping

Round 3 Summary (10-12 December 2024)

Strawberry Colour Scale Used

- 1 = Good red colour
- 2 = 1-2 fruit with white/green shoulder
- **3** = 3 or more fruit with white/green shoulder
- 4 = Most fruit with white/green colour

Strawberry Appearance Scale Used

- 1 = Almost perfect
- 2 = 1 2 fruit with bruise/blemish
- 3 = 3 or more fruit with bruise/blemish
- 4 = Rots



Colour score av. 1.00

Good red colour

Appearance score av. 2.13

- Rots & Moulds found in 1 sample
- Bruising also noted



Brix

- Av. 7.78 (ranged from 6.2-13.3)
- 37% of berries had brix below 7
- 63% of berries had brix of 7 or above



Weights and Measures

- 100% samples with declared weight (8)
- 2 samples had packed on date.
- Berry Count av. 10.9 (ranged from 9 14)



Sample Traceability

- 100% of samples traceable (8)
- 8 different growers.
- 100% displayed Product of NZ (8)



Average Price \$4.24

(equivalent to 250g)

- (Price Range \$2.98 \$9.99) for 250g
- 4 samples had multi-buy deals.



Packaging

- 88% clam shell punnets (7)
- 12% separate lid punnets (1)
- 100% of labelled punnets had barcodes (8)
- All samples were 250g punnets.
